Lori Hart, Ph.D. Awarded Jack L. Anson Award

Brentwood, Tenn.—Alpha Omicron Pi alumnae member, Lori Hart (Delta Delta/Auburn University) who has a doctorate of philosophy with a focus on educational policy studies, received the Jack L. Anson award during the Association of Fraternity/Sorority Advisors (AFA) Annual Meeting in Boston on Dec. 3. Hart was presented with the award at the Closing Banquet hosted by The Catalyst Agency, Holmes Murphy & Associates, Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity, Auburn Greek Life and Alpha Omicron Pi International Fraternity in the presence of fellow interfraternal community members, member organization staff/volunteers and higher education professionals.

This award recognizes an individual not employed in the field of higher education and has contributed to the interfraternal movement beyond their respective organization. It is named after Jack L. Anson, who was referred to as “Mr. Fraternity” while the Executive Director of the North-American Interfraternity Conference (NIC) and was an inspiration to all who support positive fraternity/sorority experiences.

Examples of her award worthy contributions include, Chairman of the North-American Interfraternity Conference Alcohol/Recruitment Committee (2005-2006), Chairman for the National Panhellenic Conference Risk Management Task Force (2009-2011), 2012 Laurel Wreath Award from the NIC for her Ladder of Risk program and many more. Hart has presented at numerous AOII events over the years and most recently was the keynote speaker for Leadership Institute 2014 and lead education sessions on AOII’s alcohol policy.

Hart is currently the Director of Educational Initiatives for Holmes Murphy & Associates and a Speaker/Trainer for The Catalyst Agency. Her past roles are with Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity as the Director of Prevention Education and a Speaker for CAMPUSPEAK, Inc.
