Panhellenics Committee

On October 20, 2018, the National Panhellenic Conference (NPC) adopted a new governance structure, which replaces the multi-member delegations with a Council of Delegates, consisting of one representative from each of NPC's 26 member organizations, and a seven-member Board of Directors, consisting of five members elected to service by the Council of Delegates and two directors appointed by their member organization (on a rotational basis). The Council of Delegates will elect the NPC chairman.

In conformance with NPC's new governance structure, AOII must revise our NPC Delegation structure. Council will vote on proposed changes at International Convention in June. Instead of an NPC Delegate and three Alternate Delegates, a Chief Panhellenic Officer and a Panhellenics Standing Committee has been proposed. These volunteer position descriptions reflect those proposed changes. Our Chief Panhellenic Officer will fulfill the NPC role on their Council of Delegates, and Panhellenics Committee Members will support the work of NPC and AOII collegiate chapter issues or concerns that pertain to Panhellenic on their campus. Please see the position descriptions and also the Call to Convention for additional information regarding the roles, responsibilities, and expectations.
