ACADEMIC & LEADERSHIP SCHOLARSHIPS

Merit-based academic scholarships are awarded each year to AOII collegiate and alumnae members pursuing undergraduate and graduate degrees. Leadership Scholarships are also awarded for members to strengthen their leadership and life skills. Opportunities are available for financial assistance for the annual Undergraduate Interfraternity Institute (UIFI) as well as the educational events Leadership Institute and Leadership Academy, hosted by Alpha Omicron Pi.

RUBY FUND

Ruby Fund grants are awarded to initiated senior collegiate members and alumnae members who are in dire need of financial assistance and whose application for assistance is approved by the Foundation's Ruby Fund Committee. Assistance has been awarded for members suffering from illnesses, homes destructed by natural disasters, loss of job and other forms of dire need.





The Loyalty Fund supports all of the other funds of the AOII Foundation. Gifts to the Loyalty Fund allow the Foundation Board of Directors the ability to direct funding where it's needed most. Therefore, we are able to continue awarding Ruby Fund grants, scholarships, leadership

and educational grants to the Fraternity and arthritis grants. Without donations to the Loyalty Fund, we can't continue administering these vital programs that support our sisters at every age.

LEADERSHIP AND EDUCATIONAL GRANTS

The Foundation provides educational and leadership grants annually to the Alpha Omicron Pi Fraternity to provide opportunities for members to gain important leadership skills, enhance personal strengths and stress the importance of today's women serving as positive role models for future AOIIs. These grants, supported through contributions to our unrestricted Loyalty Fund and investment income from the Endowment Fund, also ensure that each member has an exceptional membership experience.

ARTHRITIS GRANTS

Grants are awarded towards research, patient programming and education for arthritis, AOIIs international philanthropy. Since 1967, over \$3.5 million has been raised by AOIIs and donated through the AOII Foundation to support the mission of conquering arthritis.

Raising Roses is the AOII Foundation's annual giving society available only to collegiate members who make an annual gift of \$18.97 or above to the Loyalty Fund. This exciting program allows collegiate members to give back to AOII, while recognizing the importance of supporting our sisterhood from the very beginning. Collegiate members who join Raising Roses will be recognized with a commemorative AOII gift for becoming a member.

Raising Roses raised more than \$5,500 during our inaugural year in 2018-2019.

The Jacqueminot Circle is our monthly alumnae giving opportunity that provides recognition for our sisters who establish a recurring monthly gift of \$18.97 and above, or an equivalent annual gift between \$227 and \$1,896, to our Loyalty Fund.
